LA's Future Depends on Quality Leadership

Louisiana has many assets. Our natural resources and cultural diversity are well known and our human potential abounds. But to truly move Louisiana forward the citizen leaders of today must understand the complex issues that drive our state, recognize the opportunities that others might not see, and shape them into the reality of meaningful progress.

That's the goal of *Leadership Louisiana*. By enhancing the capacity of emerging and current Louisiana leaders to effectively address key public issues, it empowers civic-minded citizens to become involved in issues affecting their communities and the state. And they have.

As a nationally-recognized program, *Leadership Louisiana* strives for excellence in ways that are thought provoking and forward looking. It leaves its graduates with a renewed commitment to service, and a better understanding of solutions to Louisiana's most vexing problems. Presenters, guides and program partners serve to inspire participants to build on their own experiences to expand the potential of the place they call home.

Today, *Leadership Louisiana* boasts a broad network of over 1,400 alumni from every region of the state. They are leaders from many sectors – civic, business, government, university, professional, cultural and nonprofit. Together, they represent a group of committed citizens who have made a difference in Louisiana.

Program Highlights

The Leadership Louisiana program consists of six sessions that take place across the state (Thursday evening-Saturday noon, except closing session is Wednesday-Friday format). Please check your availability in conjunction with the 2024 session schedule. Attendance at all sessions is important. To graduate from the program, full participation at the opening and closing sessions is mandatory. Participants are permitted to miss the equivalent of one of the remaining sessions.

The core elements of *Leadership Louisiana* sessions include:

- Exploring critical issues and solutions with leading experts.
- On-site demonstrations, tours and excursions.
- Inspiring individuals who are making a difference.
- Open and frank dialogue through roundtable discussions.
- Insight into the people, places, politics and history that shape our state and its culture.
- Casual social and cultural activities that foster camaraderie.

Program Participation

Participants come from all geographic areas and reflect major sectors, including: corporate, professional, government, finance, news media, education, arts, industry, health care, legal, university, political, non-profit, etc. *Leadership Louisiana* seeks individu-

als who have demonstrated an interest and willingness to lead, are civic-minded, reached high-level professional status, and share a commitment to help Louisiana move forward.

Applications are reviewed by a selection committee consisting of program alumni. They specifically look for individuals who have demonstrated leadership roles in their community as well as significant professional accomplishments. CABL does not select anyone in a year which he/she is running for a state or legislative office. Spouses or persons working for the same company or organization are not selected for the same class. Applying for the class does not guarantee selection. Class size is limited and CABL seeks to ensure that the class as a whole reflects various job sectors and the geographic diversity of the state. Selection letters and registration materials are mailed in early November with tuition due in mid-December before the opening session.

Tuition for the program is \$3,200. Participants are responsible for transportation to and from sessions and hotel accommodations (CABL secures special rates). Partial tuition scholarships are available to applicants from small businesses or nonprofits. Contact shere@cabl.org for a scholarship request form.
